Description: This is a DVD driven course from the Institute for Excellence in Writing that lays a very solid foundation of writing skills and gives students a strong “toolbox” for writing well, whether they are a reluctant writer or a writer that just needs to hone their skills. Over the course of two semesters, students will learn how to effectively use a wide range of structural models and stylistic techniques in their compositions, as they write on a variety of enjoyable fiction and non-fiction topics. In level B, we will be working on note taking, summarizing both narrative stories and reference materials, research reports, and creative writing. Along the way we will be developing stylistic tools like using a banned word list and learning some ways to “dress up” our writing. There will be weekly writing homework for this class, and parents are encouraged to be involved by editing for their students.

AEROPLANE: THE WRIGHT BROTHERS

Description: We will be reading through the only authorized biography of Orville and Wilbur Wright. In this non-technical story of the invention of the first true human flying machine, the author shares the dedication of the Wright brothers as they sought to solve the problem of flying, devoting all of their time and personal funds to the mission. Their story is one of triumph, disbelief by fellow Americans, adoration by Europeans and finally, the recognition they earned. The Wright Brothers were patient and dedicated, even in the face of skeptics and being snubbed by the Smithsonian for decades. In addition to reading through the book (at home) we will be using a study guide to discuss what we have read each week. There will be bonus links to be viewed at home to enrich these discussions. Some topics covered in the bonus links are patents/trademarks, wood carving/block printing (we will be doing our own version of this in class), researching the Wright way, the Smithsonian controversy, and so much more. In addition to discussing the book in class, we will also learn about the engineering design process as well as the engineering concepts of airplanes (lift, drag, thrust, weight) and test these concepts using paper airplanes. The students will then use that knowledge to design and craft their own kite and then their own airplane/glider. They will need to not only design their kite/airplane but also choose and provide their own materials (not covered in the cost of the class) to build and craft their kite and aircraft. This will be done in teams as learning to work as a team is part of the engineering design process. I hope to have a guest speaker to talk to the class about aerodynamics one week. I also plan to set up a field trip to the Booneville-Baldwyn airport. This class will work best for students who are self-motivated learners who are able to work independently as well as with others in teams with very little instruction and oversight. There will be outside homework to prepare for class each week.

Without glorifying graffiti, we will study it as we learn about beautiful lettering or fonts (a.k.a. typography). It's no secret that learning to write decorative letters is becoming a lost art. Typography is the art of designing the letters and words we use every day. Typography can be used in a decorative way to add beauty to the written word and a lot of time and consideration is spent on the typography that you see every day in advertising and daily life. There are contemporary artists that use numbers and letters in their art, graphic artists that must use typography in very trendy ways, and artists that are paid to legally paint their "tags" and messages. I'll give the kids some deep questions to consider on what they think and what the Bible says about graffiti. We will study all these aspects of graffiti including seeing the elements of art (line, shape, color, space, texture, and value), but most of our time will be spent creating some awesome works of art in this same style using numbers and letters, ranging from simple words to complicated, multi-colored images. Student Writing Intensive Level C

Description: This is a DVD driven course from the Institute for Excellence in Writing that lays a very solid foundation of writing skills and gives students a strong “toolbox” for writing well, whether they are a reluctant writer or a writer that just needs to hone their skills. Over the course of two semesters, students will learn how to effectively use a wide range of structural models and stylistic techniques in their compositions, as they write on a variety of enjoyable fiction and non-fiction topics. In level C, we will be working on note taking, summarizing both narrative stories and reference materials, research reports, creative writing, as well as introducing some essay writing models. Along the way we will be developing stylistic tools like using a banned word list, learning some ways to “dress up” our writing, and how to take notes from a live lecture. There will be weekly writing homework for this class, and parents are encouraged to be involved by editing for their students.
